Tyler County Speedway Joins UFO Race Championship Tour!

BDS Promotions and the UFO Race Championship presented by Comcast have come to an agreement to hold a 2008 tour event at the Tyler County Speedway. The 21st Annual Earl Hill Memorial Championship will take place on Sunday, Night, August 3 and will feature a \$4,000 to win, "Area 51-lap" Super Late Model Championship race.

With the addition of Tyler County Speedway, the tour has also designated its boundaries. The tour will operate within a 125-mile radius of Monroeville PA, which is a central point between the initial two speedways to join the tour. Tyler County Speedway will serve as the southern-most venue to host an event. The UFO Race Championship presented by Comcast has been designed to allow regional race teams to participate in a tour schedule without the expense of massive travel and minimal conflict with other events.

The Tyler County Speedway is an ultra-exciting, ¼ mile steeply-banked clay track renowned for close, side-by-side action. The speedway has flourished under the efforts of BDS and their management team continues to be on the cutting edge of motors ports promotions by hosting the only UFO Race Championship presented by Comcast event to take place in the state of West Virginia in 2008. BDS had originally planned a \$3,000 to win event, but increased the race to \$4,000 to win as well as increasing all feature positions after becoming part of the UFO tour. West Virginia race fans will have their only chance to experience the UFO race format south of the Mason-Dixon line. The event will take place one day before the opening of the week-long, annual Tyler County Fair.

The UFO Race Championship presented by Comcast is an exciting new concept which aligns area clay-surface speedways with unified rules and procedures. Super Late Model rules include the option of an unlimited motor or a cost-cutting spec motor, with an open tire rule in place for all events. The addition of the Earl Hill Memorial Championship at the Tyler County Speedway boosts the Super Late Model tour prize money to over \$334,000 of payoffs including a season-ending points bonus.
